





En-route to Yaraka from Tambo the tag-along tour had a morning tea break at Blackall.




The festivities began with great expectations and the concert concluded as the sun set and the beauty of Mount Slocombe and the valleys below came alive with the rays of an incredible setting sun.



















# Alice Springs



























As the sun sets on the rocks our tour draws to a close. We have enjoyed our last concert and our last Happy Hour.

Tomorrow we will head off to all corners of our country, wealthier for our experiences and looking forward to tag-along number three in 2016.




